

# POINTS TO 2 IN SLAYING

## Hair Samples In Starved Rock Triple Killing From Two Men

Science has produced evidence that two men—instead of one—killed the wives of three Chicago business executives in Starved Rock State Park.

New information to that effect was disclosed today by Sheriff Ray Eutsey and Lt. Emil Toffant of the Illinois state police.

The sheriff termed it the best lead in the case thus far.

The officials said hair samples taken from the hand of one of the victims and the glove of another had been analyzed at laboratories of the Eastman Kodak Co. in Rochester, N.Y. One sample was brown, the other blond.

In detailing the findings, the officials said the brown hair came from an adult male. The blond hair also came from a male, but the officers did not use the term "adult" in their report on it to newsmen.

They didn't describe the brown hair in detail, but they did say it is of a distinctive type and could be identified easily. They also expressed the opinion that the age of the brown-haired man could be deduced from it.

After some uncertainty in the early phases of the investigation, officials had settled on the theory that the women were slain by one powerful man of the reclusive "lone wolf" type.
