ARRANGEMENTS:

At the request of State's Attorney, Harland Warren, LaSalle County, Ottawa, Illinois, three subjects were examined by the Polygraph detection of deception technique regarding the killing of three women in the Starved Rock State Park, March 14, 1960.

The examination was made at the LaSalle County Court House, April 29, 1960.

RESULTS:

- #1. Stanley Tucker
- #2. Chester Weger
- #3. Willis J. Williams

were each given three polygraph tests.

Their polygrams contain no reaction to relevant questions.

CONCLUSION

After careful analysis of the polygrams of Stanley Tucker, Chester Weger and Willis J. Williams, it is the opinion of the examiner that Tucker, Weger and Williams are not withholding any relevant knowledge and did not commit the murder of the three women found in St. Louis Canyon on March 16th, 1960.

It is further my opinion that Williams did see these three women walking in an easterly direction near the circular concession stand at approximately two o'clock P.M. March 14th, 1960 and has made a true and correct statement to Investigators Angeleff and Corey concerning his activities on the afternoon of March 14th, 1960.
